# CABLE Knowledge Development Project Workshop 1 Helsinki, Finland 26 - 29 September 2018



## Context


In the last five years there have been many developments that have used the CABLE approach in different countries and contexts. The time is right to bring together a new community of CABLE practitioners to share knowledge and experience and to constitute a network for support and exchange.

#### Invitation

The organisers are involved in developing CABLE based initiatives and you are invited to participate in the upcoming workshop. The only prerequisite is that you also have experience to share and ideas to contribute as well as a desire to learn from others' practice.

# **Programme**

The programme will begin with a sharing of participant's experience and thematic reflection and on this basis specific themes will be deepened. The main entry points will be based on the CABLE approach, which involves a continuous process:



The relevance of CABLE to different sites and learning processes will also be explored. These may include, singly or in combination:

Professional development of new service models Initial learning for social and diaconal work Volunteer and activist learning programmes

Work in local communities Work with service users, volunteers and activists Cross-sectoral working (e.g. with citizens and professionals)

Congregational development Project development, especially involving civil society and/or church Organisational development (implementing CABLE across an organisation or church)

## **Continuity & Further Development**

The workshop will be followed up by further exchanges and will also provide a space for developing longer-term research and development initiatives. A special working group will be devoted to this issue.

The link of the CABLE network to the newly launched CODE Forum, which brings together three approaches on community diaconia (Use Your Talents, CABLE & Seeking Conviviality), will also be a topic for discussion. For more information about CODE please contact Tony Addy.

### **Practical Information**

The workshop will take place in Helsinki and will begin on 26<sup>th</sup> September at 14.00 and end on 29<sup>th</sup> September with lunch.

The venue will be in the city centre.
