Invitation to the International Seminar:

Innovative Learning for Community Based Action

Linz, Austria, 8 - 9 March 2016 (+ Workshop 7 March)



The aims of the Seminar are to:

- ✓ share experiences of learning programmes which have used participatory and community based methods
- ✓ **learn** from the approach to learning processes based on the so-called 'exposure process' in different contexts
- ✓ develop new learning programmes which can be used with different groups of learners
- ✓ **focus** on the theology & spirituality that underlies 'exposure based learning' and related service models.

The Seminar is for:

- ✓ trainers involved in learning programmes for local diaconal, pastoral and social action
- ✓ workers in local social and community based projects, parishes, diaconia or caritas who are seeking new ways to work for empowerment and transformation in their work
- ✓ trainers and lecturers involved in providing initial learning and education for pastoral or diaconal work, who are developing participatory and empowering approaches
- ✓ those responsible for developing new ways of working in the areas of pastoral, diaconal and mission work
- ✓ people who have participated in CABLE training and want to share and deepen their experience

Background to the Seminar

A network of organisations involved in training and learning for Christian social practice has developed a training model that is known as 'CABLE – community action based learning for empowerment'. CABLE is based on a process of biography-based learning, known as 'exposure' to work on the development of a clarified and renewed approach to work in context.

The CABLE approach has been used to **train new workers in the field, in degree programmes and in in-service training.** It has been applied in both 'community' and 'institutional' settings.

The CABLE approach has also been used **with members of community groups, local congregations and with service users** in localities and in service organisations.

The Cardijn Association has been pioneering this approach in Linz and now wishes to share with others in developing new steps in the work locally, nationally and internationally.

Programme of the Seminar

The programme will give a space for those who have used this approach to share it with others and to develop and deepen it in relation to different groups of learners and contexts. It will also give attention to the theological and spiritual learning from such processes.

There will be an open evening of the seminar on Tuesday to which interested and active people from the Linz area will be invited. The focus of this will be on theological reflection on exposure based learning and work.

Pre-Seminar Workshop 7th March

For those unfamiliar with the practice of exposure based learning a one-day participatory workshop will be organised one day before the seminar starts. For those new to the methodology we recommend participating in this workshop.

Workshop: The preparatory workshop will be held on Monday 7^{th} March from 9.00 until 18.00 and participants from outside Linz may arrive on the Sunday evening

Seminar: The seminar will run from 9.00 on 8^{th} until 18.00 on 9^{th} March and there will be a social evening on 9^{th} . Departures will be after breakfast on 10^{th} March.
